

3D Paper Winter Scene



Create an awesome 3D winter scene! This winter wonderland can be created with materials you have at home and then be decorated however you wish. Get creative and have fun during these long, cold winter days!

Materials

- 1 piece of 8.5x11 white computer paper
- 1 half piece of 8.5x11 (4.25 x 5.5) blue, purple or black paper
- Scrap pieces of colored paper for decorations
- Glue stick
- Scissors
- Markers


Instructions

1.




Using your piece of white computer paper, accordion fold it starting on the short end, leaving a few inches unfolded. This leftover part will be the “snow” in the background of your scene!

2.




Keeping your paper folded, fold the entire paper in half like a book. The accordion folded parts should line up. Unfold it.

3.



Using a glue stick, add glue to the front of the accordion fold section. Pinch the fronts together creating a half circle shape. Fluff and adjust it so that the accordion is spread out and it all stands up on its own. If you want, you can trim the background snow with scissors to give it a more natural shape!

4.



Get your "sky" piece of half paper (blue, black, purple, etc.) trim the top 2 corners on a long side using scissors into rounded shapes. This will be the "sky" in your 3D scene. If you want to add stars or snow to the paper before adding it to the rest, you can! For example, I used liquid white out to add some snow!

5.



Using a glue stick, add glue to the bottom 1/3 of your sky paper, opposite of the rounded corners. Add glue to the backside of the snow floor section for added support. Attach the sky to the backside of the snow section.

6.



Now it is time to decorate your winter wonderland! Using scissors, markers, and scrap paper, create houses, snowmen, trees, stars, anything you'd like to add to your scene!

7.



Using a glue stick, attach your decorations to the background, sky, and snow using the folds of the white paper as a support! The possibilities are endless!
